Grant/Loan Program	Program Purpose	Due Date
The Wahlert Foundation	Grants are made for basic human needs, such as: emergency assistance for families, medical care for seminarians from foreign countries, domestic violence prevention, food and housing for the needy, scholarships for low-income students, crisis care for children, food vouchers, and safety upgrades for a homeless shelter.	Applications are accepted during the months of June, July and August

Redevelopment Tax Credits Brownfield/Grayfield Sites	Brownfield sites are abandoned, idled or underutilized industrial or commercial properties where real or perceived environmental contamination prevents productive expansion or redevelopment. Examples of Brownfield sites include former gas stations, dry cleaners, and other commercial operations that may have utilized products or materials potentially hazardous to the environment.  Grayfield sites are abandoned public buildings, industrial or commercial properties that are vacant, blighted, obsolete or otherwise underutilized. A grayfield has been developed and has infrastructure in place but the property's current use is outdated or prevents a better or more efficient use of the property.	
<u>Traffic Safety Improvement</u> <u>Program</u>	Funds to cities and counties for roadway safety improvements, research, studies or public information initiatives.	15-Aug-21
BuylT@OCIO program	Each city in lowa is eligible for up to \$9,500 for approved technology equipment purchases. Applications are due August 15, fast action is required in order to receive your funds. There will not be an extension to this deadline.	15-Aug-21

Dyersville Area Community Foundation	The Dyersville Area Community Foundation makes grants to nonprofits with a 501 C (3) status that are located in the communities of Dyersville, Earlville, Farley, Luxemburg, New Vienna, Petersburg, and Worthington.	31-Aug-21
Iowa Tourism Grant	The lowa Tourism Grant (ITG) Program promotes tourism in lowa by funding tourism-related marketing initiatives, meetings and events that benefit both local economies and the state's economy. Applications are available annually, and preference will be given to those that support the overall marketing plan of the lowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA) in terms of its target audiences and messaging.	The FY2022 grant cycle will be announced in August 2021
Silos & Smokestacks National Heritage Area Large & Small Project Grants	Large Project Awards – To leverage larger and varied local support for planning assistance, educational programs, interpretation, marketing, exhibit displays, interpretive signage and other special projects. Large Project Awards will be \$3,000 or above.  Small Project Awards – Provide SSNHA Sites with financial support including planning assistance, educational programs, interpretation, marketing, exhibit displays, interpretive signage and other special projects. Small Project Awards will be below \$3,000.	30-Aug-21

Theisen's More for your  Community Grants	The Theisen's More for Your Community corporate grant program annually makes grants to all Theisen's store communities. The program grants to agencies that most effectively, directly serve the basic needs of families and children, which includes food, shelter, education, safety and health.	31-Aug-21
*	This program assists with redevelopment aimed at improving lowa's economy while reducing environmental hazards.	1-Sep-21
Revitalize Iowa's Sound Economy (RISE)	Funding provided to assist in promoting economic development in lowa through construction or improvements of roads and streets. Funding may be in the form of a grant, loan or combination thereof.	1-Sep-21
<u>Grants for Tech</u>	The grant program will pay for technology improvements for nonprofits to help make their organizations more effective and grow stronger. Eligible organizations are within the City of Dubuque including 501(c)3 nonprofits, church, school or government organizations that do not employ IT staff.	10-Sep-21
River Bluff Community Foundation (RBCF) Grant	The River Bluff Community Foundation offers the Impact Grant as a way of partnering with community organizations to enhance and improve the general quality of life. Grants awarded range from \$500 to \$5,000. Must be nonprofit organizations that provide services within Clinton and Camanche.	30-Sep-21
